## What is the Kansas Community Health Corps?

The Kansas Community HealthCorps is an **AmeriCorps** service program that works to link medically underserved individuals and families to culturally appropriate and comprehensive health care.

Corps members' positions include:

- Providing outreach to and support to medically underserved children and families
- Improving access to quality health care and services
- Signing up children for Kansas' state insurance program
- Connecting low-income individuals to community resources through case management
- Reducing the need for emergency health care through health education

## What are the benefits of becoming a HealthCorps Member?

A Community HealthCorps member will receive:

- For a year of service, full time members will complete 1700 hours. Part time members complete 900 hours.
- Full time members are paid \$838 each month in a living stipend, part time \$444.
- Local and national trainings, conferences and workshops about AmeriCorps, the underserved, CPR, and Kansas health issues.
- Full time members will receive \$4,725 (part time \$2,363) Education Award to pay student loans or tuition.
- Health insurance, child care reimbursement and payment of student loans during service.

## What is required to be a HealthCorps Member?

- You must be 17 years of age or older
- Have a high school diploma (or equivalent) or be willing to work toward completing it during year of service
- Be a U.S. Citizen or legal permanent resident.
- Be committed to serving an underserved community and have an interest in community service.
